INTRODUCTION (03 points)

The integration of computers in language testing. (test-takers can compare paper and pencil tests to computerized based testing)

BODY (15 points)

Paragraph 1: Advantages

- Time management: time can be measured, controlled, and recorded by computers.
- 2. Easy to develop, administer, and score.
- Computers can develop tasks that are similar to real-world tasks (authentic tasks).
- Computers can be linked to other equipments. This allows providing a variety of input and presentation (e.g., testing many abilities/skills at once).
- 5. Computer-based test items can elicit specific answers.
- The test items in computerized tests can be adopted to the test takers' general ability.
- 7. The answers of the test takers can be recorded and archived.
- 8. Encourage self-evaluation and offer immediate feedback.
- 9. Foster test-takers' autonomy.
- 10. Test-taker's performance can be compared to other test-takers' performance and placed in a mathematical ranks.

Paragraph 2: Disadvantages

- 1. Computer unfamiliarity affects the performance of test-takers.
- 2. Most of computerized tests are based on multiple-choice questions. The latter do not often consider productive and constructed questions.
- 3. Open-ended questions are less likely to appear.
- 4. The human interactive element is absent.
- 5. Lack of security and possibility of cheating.
- 6. Test-takers cannot skip questions or modify already submitted answers.
- 7. Automatic scoring for constructed questions is not always accurate (especially essays and open-ended questions....)
